Funded by bp, the Katy ISD Education Foundation's leading investor, our new bp Aiming for #NetZero grant program provides targeted support for innovative grants elevating the impact of Science, Technology, Engineering and Math instruction in the classroom. Grants should demonstrate the potential for real-world experience while aligning with bp's goal of reducing CO2 emissions and helping the world reach net zero by 2050 or sooner.

Grants will be screened, scored, and evaluated via the Katy ISD Education Foundation's Inspiring Imagination grant process and must comply with the foundation's stringent grant criteria. All grant awards are for one year and must be applied for annually.

GRANT CATEGORIES:

- **Campus Collaborative** grant for three *campuses* or more up to \$5,000*
- Campus Collaborative grant for two *campuses* up to \$2,500*
- Team grant for three *teachers* or more at the same campus up to \$5,000**
- **Team grant for two** *teachers* at the same campus up to \$2,500
- Individual *teacher* up to \$1,000

CAMPUS COLLABORATIVE GRANT GUIDELINES*

Campus Collaborative grant expenditures may not include the following *fixed asset inventory items* per Katy ISD restrictions:

Capital – asset with a useful life greater than 1 year and cost of \$5,000 or greater. Trackable - vehicles/trailers/golf carts, welding machines, computers, cameras, camcorders, TVs, projectors, smart boards, copiers, tablets and handheld data devises

TEAM GRANT GUIDELINES**

Katy ISD Instructional Coaches may *only* be included as an *additional applicant* to a team that *already includes three or more teachers* directly involved in classroom instruction.

An *individual teacher* may be listed on *no more than two* (2) *grant applications total*, including individual and team grants, and listed as *Lead Teacher on only one application*, either team or individual.

APPLICANT ELIGIBILITY

All **Katy ISD teachers or teams of teachers** on the same campus, including counselors and librarians, who are directly involved in student instruction are eligible to apply.

Katy ISD teachers or teams of teachers on *different* campuses, including counselors and librarians, who are directly involved in student instruction are eligible to apply for a **Campus Collaborative** grant with the **required signature of each individual campus principal**.

All **itinerant teachers** who are directly involved in student instruction are eligible to apply with **district supervisor** signature rather than that of a campus principal.



All applications must comply with the following to be considered for funding

CAMPUS PRINCIPAL SIGNATURE

<u>Original campus principal signature</u> is required in blue ink on the original application, including all Campus Collaborative principals. No signature stamps. District supervisor signature following the same criteria is required for **itinerant teachers**.

Campus principal signature certifies

- Grant application complies with all Foundation Grant Guidelines
- Campus is prepared to support grant implementation should the grant be funded
- All teachers listed on a team application participated in its preparation and will be engaged in its implementation

APPLICATION CRITERIA

Applications must be originally written. *No duplicate applications will be accepted.*

Requests must be *equal to or less than the maximum amount allowed for the grant category*. Applications exceeding grant category limits will not be considered for funding.

Itemized budget should include only Katy ISD approved vendors.

Technology components must adhere to Katy ISD Technology Standards.

Professional development, **refreshments**, **compensation for substitute teachers**, and **salaries or stipends for additional staffing** will not be funded and *should be excluded* from the budget summary.

Important! Campus name and teacher names should *only be cited on the application cover sheet*. Any reference that reveals campus identity in the project title and application narrative will result in *lost points or disqualification*.

A grant activity will be funded for **no more than three consecutive years** at the same campus.

BOTH electronic and original signed copy of the grant application must be received by the Foundation office by 5:00 P.M., Tuesday, February 27th.



Grant Scoring and Implementation

GRANT SCORING CRITERIA

Grants are scored by our Foundation Board of Directors and community volunteers. *Not all grant proposals are funded.* **Quality of application matters**, as does the *innovation and integrity of the idea itself*.

Awards will be made based on how well a grant project:

- Includes innovative practices that incorporate the Katy ISD Instructional Cornerstones
- Includes **high-quality educational content** and **positively impacts** students and their educational community
- **Complements and supports** Katy ISD curriculum and instructional objectives and **enriches student learning**
- The purpose of this grant program is not primarily to increase performance on a standardized test but rather to **enhance and extend students' classroom experiences**
- The project must promote **advancement of skills or knowledge** and **add depth to educational programming**

GRANT SCORING PROCESS

Grants are chosen using a **three-step blind evaluation process**. *Campus and teacher names are hidden on all applications, ensuring evaluation on merit alone*.

The Foundation office first reviews each application for compliance with **Foundation Grant Guidelines**, then advances qualified applications to the scoring process.

Steps:

- 1. Katy ISD Teaching & Learning and Katy ISD Technology divisions *review* for compliance with district instructional and technology standards. Other administrative divisions may also review if necessitated by the grant request.
- 2. Individual scoring by Foundation board and committee members
- 3. **Team scoring** by Foundation board and committee members who individually scored the same grants

Foundation board and committee scoring rubric available for review on page 5.

Grant scoring teams prioritize their assigned grants using total score and team collaboration. Grants are then funded in priority order. *The number of grants awarded each year depends on both total funds raised and set aside by the Foundation and the number of grants deemed by scoring teams to merit funding.*



Grant Scoring and Implementation

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

The Foundation funds only school projects that augment and enrich the curriculum and **do not supplant programs traditionally funded by district**, **state or federal budgets**.

Adjustments may be made to the budget summary after a grant is approved for funding, provided that additional or adjusted purchases fall within the scope of the grant proposal and the grant funding guidelines.

All purchases made possible by grant funds will be made through the **Katy ISD External Funding Department.**

TEACHER REQUIREMENTS IF CHOSEN FOR GRANT FUNDING:

All grant recipients, including all team grant members, will be expected to:

- Use the **awards** for the **purpose intended**
- Use **Katy ISD approved vendors** and follow district purchasing procedures and technology standards
- Present a grant project evaluation via survey response at the end of the school year
- Acknowledge the Katy ISD Education Foundation in any printed material or presentations
- Failure to fulfill all grant requirements may *jeopardize* the receipt of current and future grant funds.

OWNERSHIP OF GRANT MATERIALS:

Grant materials will remain at the receiving campus should the grant recipient transfer to another school. Another teacher on the receiving campus can implement the project, or the funds will be returned to the Katy ISD Education Foundation.

The **lead teacher's campus** will be responsible for all materials purchased under the **Campus Collaborative** option.

As referenced in Katy ISD board policy (CY local), **the district shall own any work or work product created by a District employee** in the course and scope of his or her employment, including the right to obtain copyrights.
